History

Story Arc

Act I

Act I introduces the history of TYWLC, the characters involved, the goals and motives of each, and community validation for the need of programs like this one in the city of Trenton, NJ.

Act II

Act II invites the audience into the operations of the organization, allowing them to see for themselves the highs, the lows, the challenges, and the impact that TYWLC has on both the leadership and students involved. The audience is along for the ride through the small wins and hard-fought losses, both on the mat and beyond.

Act III

Act III reframes the audience's perspective, shifting focus from the minutiae of the day-to-day aspects of the program to the bigger picture. This act highlights student outcomes, community impact, and the importance of investing in one's community sustainably.



Narrative Style

The documentary employs non-linear storytelling interweaving past and present, highlighting human striving, community giving, personal growth, and successful outcomes.

Cinematography

The film employs a verité style for documentary elements, with natural lighting and handheld camera movement. It prioritizes a polished, cinematic style for sit-down interviews.

Music & Sound

The film will feature an original score and sound design, complementing the film's realism and captivating its audience.

Editing Style

The documentary employs dynamic pacing, with faster cuts for high-energy scenes and slower cuts for emotionally impactful scenes. This technique allows the film to capture the ecstasy and gravitas of the characters and their experiences.

Transitions between past and present storylines will be triggered through sit-down interview content to facilitate a smooth narrative flow.
